With Christian Aid we pray for South Sudan which, following a power crisis in 2013, has spiralled into a conflict, which has spread across most parts of the country and led to deaths of thousands of people and widespread displacement.

Today, over 7 million people - half of the population - are facing extreme hunger and high rates of acute malnutrition. Christian Aid's South Sudan country programme recognises that ultimately the only solution to the humanitarian crisis is for there to be peace, and therefore combines humanitarian response, with work to tackle conflict and build peace, and facilitates access to essential services, especially health care.

We pray for Graeme and Sarah marrying here on Friday, and we continue to pray for the family of Pat Taylor and for all who mourn her passing.
