### This week

We pray for Sudan and South Sudan. In April a fierce war erupted in Sudan, which is still continuing, growing in scope and brutality. In western Sudan, away from the cameras of the media, multiple atrocities have been committed. Six million people have been forced from their homes. Thousands are struggling to find shelter, sleeping under trees by the roadside without having access to food, shelter, clean drinking water or other essentials. Many families are trapped in the war zones - people who could not afford transport, or families with members who could not easily run, or people who just hoped the fighting would not last long. Now they have no way of escape. The UN describe it as an unimaginable humanitarian crisis.

Susan Hendrickse Clarence sent the following, last Thursday: Just before we left to return to South Africa, Susan had a fall & banged her head, left shoulder & left hip. Kendal Trauma scanned her head, examined her hip & X-Rayed her left shoulder & said all was well. Her shoulder didn't heal & if anything got worse. They X-Rayed it again, & said it was fine. When we got to SA it was even worse, so I took her to a physio who said there was definitely something more seriously wrong with her left shoulder, & referred her to a shoulder specialist who sent her for a scan. Anyway, it turned out that Susan had injured her left shoulder muscle beyond repair. Today she had a left shoulder replacement operation. She seems to have come through it alright, in some pain, but hopefully will feel a bit better after a good night's sleep.
